

Make your own Tudor Neck Ruff

Materials

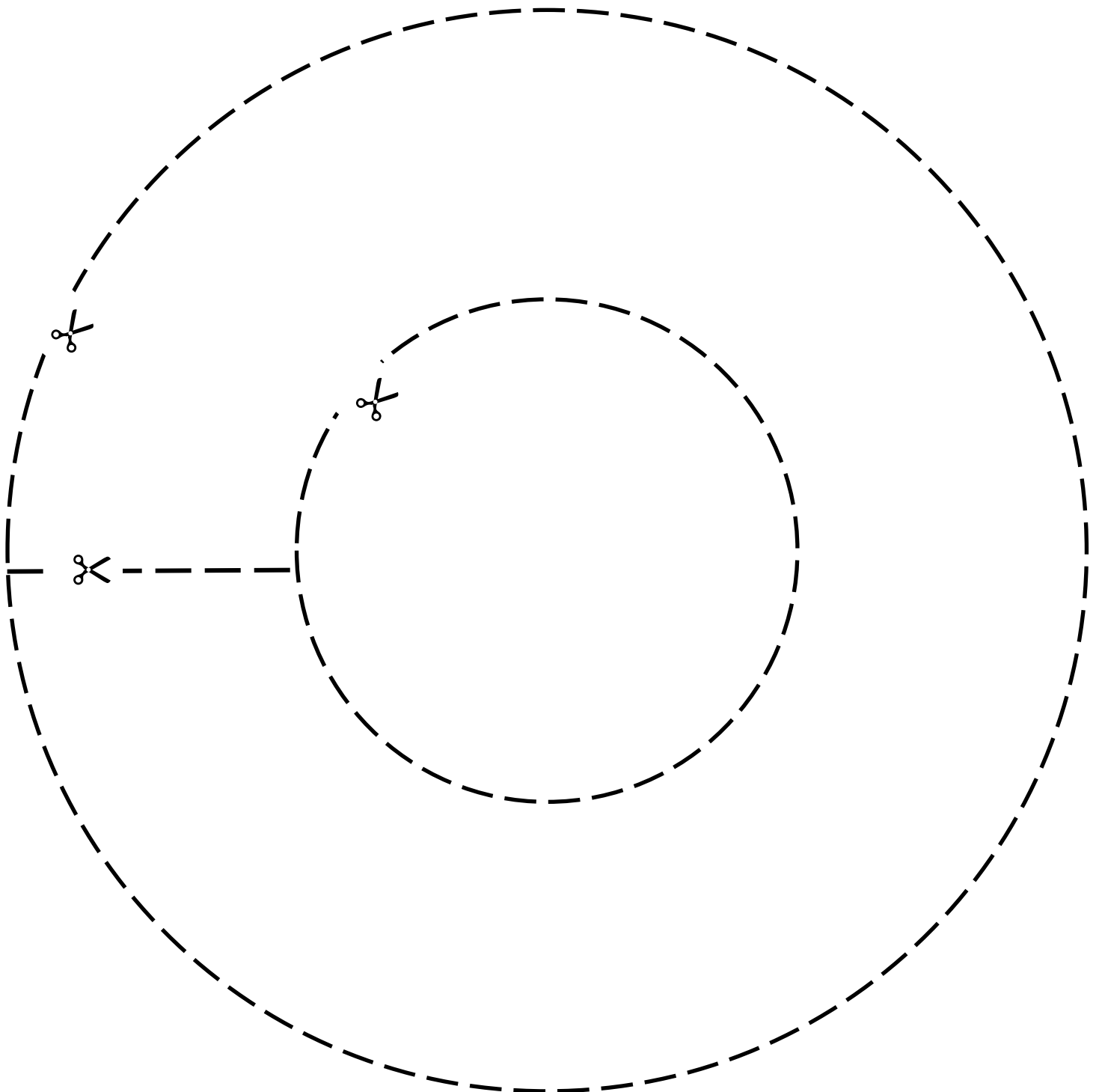
PVA glue and a brush

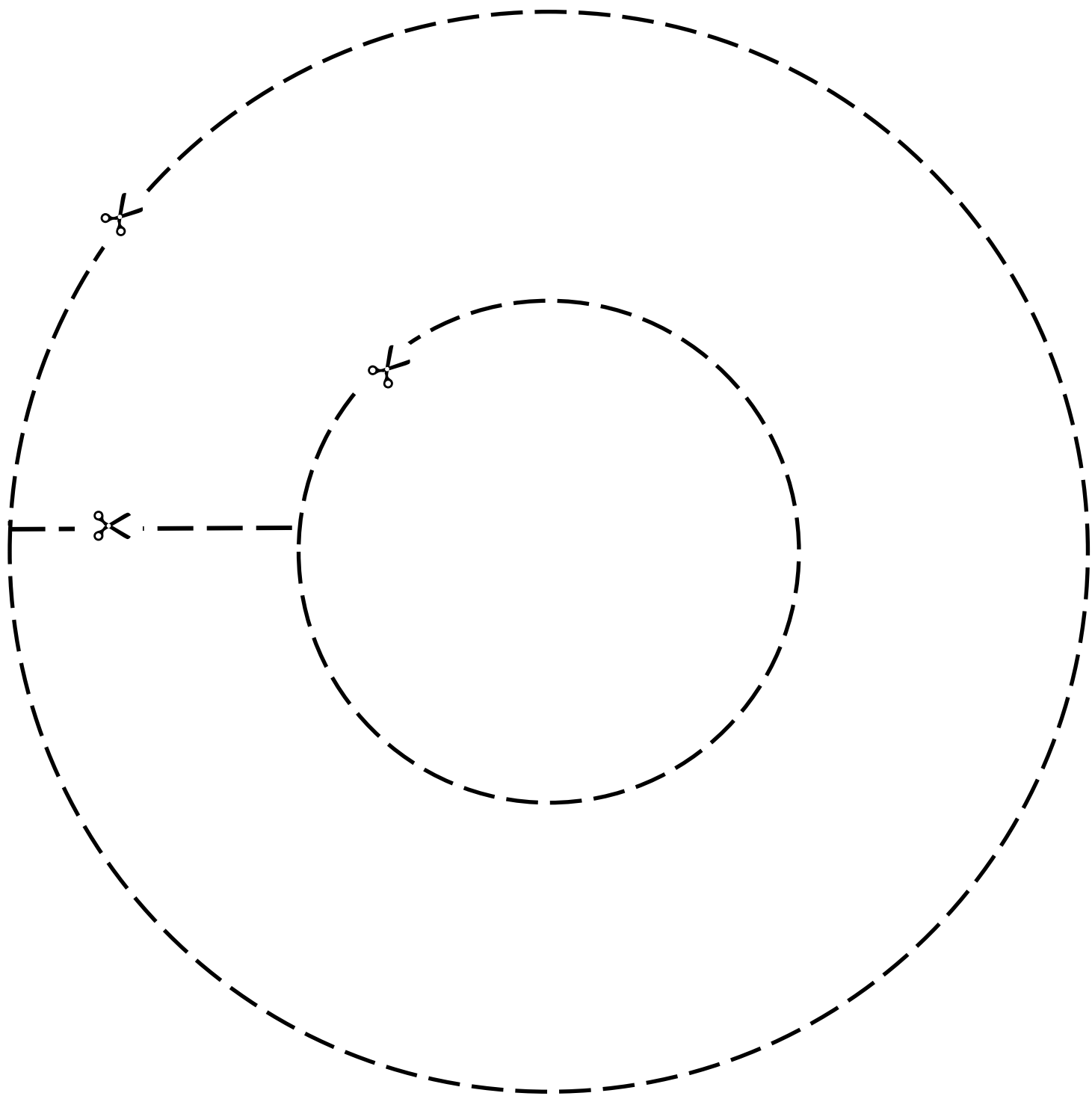
Scissors

Pens, pencils or paints to colour your ruff

Instructions

1. Enlarge and copy this PDF on to A3 paper or card.
2. Cut out the two large circles, and the four rectangles.
3. Glue the four rectangles together to make one long rectangle. Fold into a concertina.
4. Create your design on one side of each of the circular cutouts.
5. Line up the edges of the concertina with the blank side of one of the circular cutouts.
6. Carefully glue the edge of each fold to the blank side of one circular cutout.
7. Repeat step 6 with the second circular cutout to complete your ruff. Allow to dry before use.
